Section II - PROJECT DESCRIPTION

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large?

PACE's mission as a 501(c)(3) organization is to provide support, financial and otherwise, to Emerson Charter Middle School and its four academies. Our student body is composed of a diverse group of students with notable numbers in the following subgroups - Hispanic, African-American, English Learners, students with disabilities and the socioeconomically disadvantaged.

Emerson is qualified to receive federal funding under the Title 1 program because 64% of our enrolled students come from low-income families. Almost 18% of our student population has an active IEP, or an Individualized Education Program which ensures that students with disabilities receive specialized instruction and support services. Finally, almost 32% of our students are designated as English Learners.

Despite the obvious need at Emerson, the administration will be losing its PSW and PSA positions next year due to anticipated budget cuts. PACE's mission has never been more critical - to support our diverse student body and to supplement the enrichment programs that the school budget cannot cover.

PACE is committed to providing an equitable educational experience to all students, including opportunities to attend field trips and off-campus experiences which expose students to new experiences, people, parts of their city, and learning opportunities. Unfortunately, many of Emerson's field trip destinations are closed off to a significant group of our students because of financial, and other, barriers. A Neighborhood Purpose Grant helps PACE to remove some of these barriers.
